

“Order My Steps” is a prayer we want to carry with us. Psalm 119:133 (NRSV) says, “Keep my steps steady according to your promise, and never let iniquity have dominion over me.” In a world full of competing voices and quick paths, this verse invites us to ask for steadiness: a life shaped by God’s promise, step by step.

Touring Choir gives our students a living picture of what that steadiness can look like. As they visit congregations that have long supported Dock Mennonite Academy, as well as congregations who have connected more recently, students see how God stitches faith communities together—many churches, many worship spaces, one shared commitment to nurture young people in Christ. These relationships collaborate in deepening our students’ faith, widening their awareness of the body of Christ, and strengthening their understanding that they belong to something larger than themselves.

We also challenge students to think about “keeping our steps steady” in a wider context. That might mean singing across Europe, offering music at Carnegie Hall, serving and learning in Washington, D.C., organizing food-service projects, or building relationships through simple acts of care—like second graders making crafts with friends at a local retirement community. In every place, students are invited to see the broader world and the distinctive ways God calls them to witness through humility, curiosity, service, and joyful excellence.

As you read this program and hear these songs, may we all be reminded of the gifts God has given each of us—and how, with God’s help, those gifts can become acts of service that keep our steps steady according to God’s promise.
